CIRCLE U.'LYMPICS

This ambitious project, supported by Circle U. and led by the UFR STAPS Département of Université Paris Cité, King's College London and Aarhus University, offers a series of events, held over several months, and united under the theme of Olympism and the Olympic Games.

In the **initial phase**, 4 online sessions will take place between January and April 2024. Athletes, researchers and doctoral students from the nine Circle U. partner universities will share their research and personal experiences on the theme of Olympism and the Olympics, from an interdisciplinary perspective.

In the **second phase**, from April 22nd to April 26th 2024, students will be invited to attend a variety of events over the course of five days. This will involve workshops, debates, roundtables as well as outings, sporting challenges and film screenings in the evenings. This event will bring together 80 students from across the Circle U. alliance (5 students from each of the 8 participating universities (n = 40) alongside 40 students from the host institution).

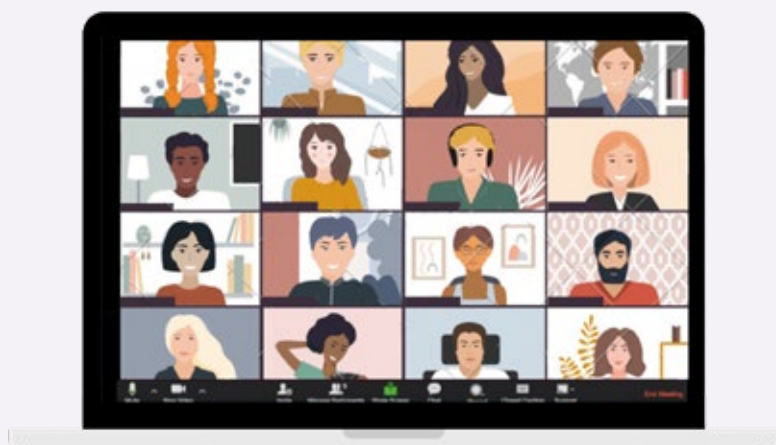

PRESENTATION

In the first phase of this project, 4 interdisciplinary talks, delivered online (and possibly in person, for those in Paris) will take place. The speakers will present their research or share their own experience.

The discussions will cover a wide range of topics and might include the ecological impact of hosting an international sporting event, to the links between sport and genetics, sports science, and nutrition.

AIMS

- To familiarize students with the world of Olympics and Paralympic sport.
- Encourage exchanges and collaboration between the diverse institutions and European universities of Circle U.
- Share knowledge and perspectives relating to the sports science disciplines and beyond.
- Developing critical thinking and analytical skills of participants.

This week of activities in Paris, will see students from across Circle U coming together as a group to take part in talks, debates, visits, and film screenings, all around the Olympic theme

PRESENTATION

The second phase will involve the hosting of the Circle U'lympics Week, which will run from 22 to 16 April 2024 in Paris.

During this intensive period, each morning will be given over to talks and debates while the afternoons will be reserved for a variety of activities including visits, screenings, Olympiads and other sporting challenges.

AIMS

- To familiarize students with Olympics and paralympic sports, through the screening of documentaries and films on the topic, alongside opportunities to get involved with activities (e.g. blind football and wheelchair basketball).
- Develop students' creativity, reasoning, and critical thinking skills through debates and round table discussions.
- Build participants' language skills by holding activities in English.
- Offer students from across Circle U the opportunity to meet each other and explore Paris, as the city prepares to host the 2024 Olympic Games.

Based in the heart of the capital, Université Paris Cité (UParis Cité) is among the most prestigious French and international establishments, thanks to its very high-level research, its outstanding higher education programs, its support for innovation and its active contribution to the development of the European space of research and training. This intensive activity is illustrated by its international ranking (e.g. ARWU: 78th in the world and 4th in France; Leiden: 32nd and 1st).

To join Université Paris Cité is to choose exigence and commitment to strong values, those of public service, scientific and intellectual rigor, but also curiosity and openness to the world and to others.

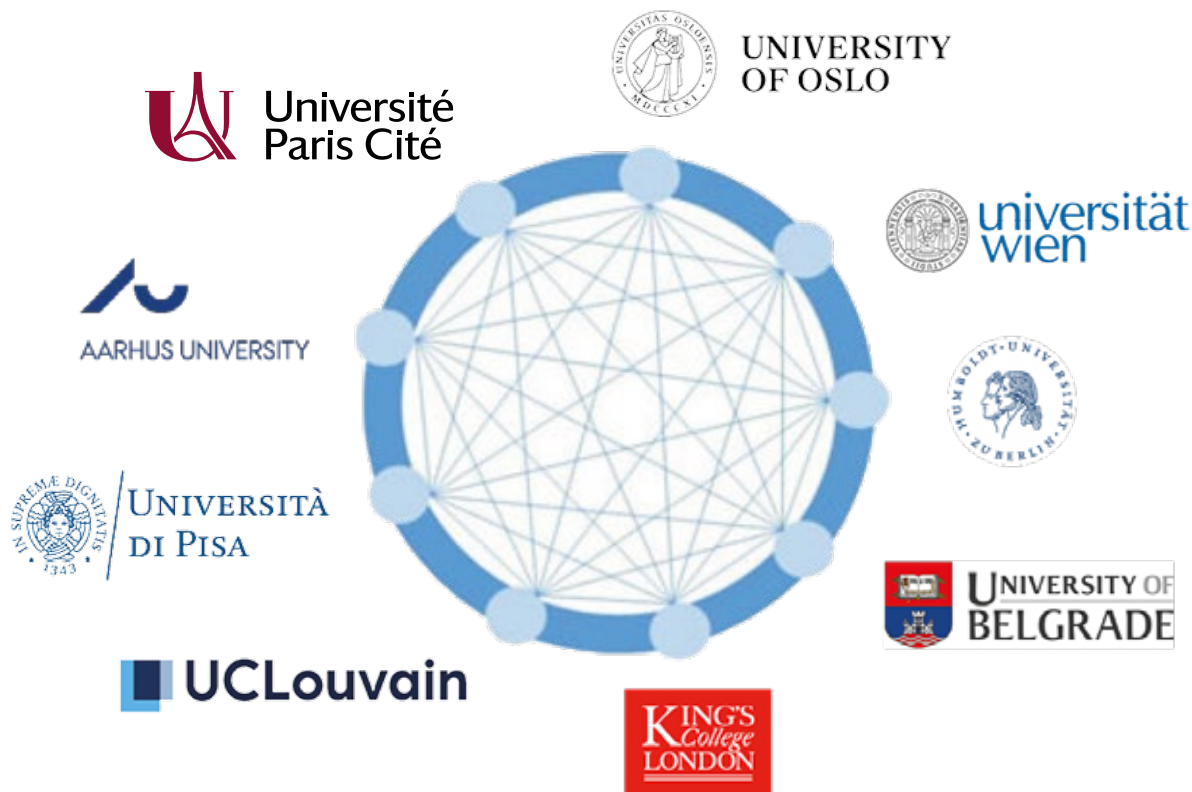


SPORTS DEPARTEMENT WHO ARE WE ?

The UFR STAPS Departement of the Université Paris Cité is the only one school of sport sciences based in Paris since 1928. It is home for 1450 students, studying across all levels on bachelors masters doctoral programs.

From an education perspective, the programmes of study at STAPS require physical aptitude but also a diverse range of scientific, literary, and technical skills. The acquisition of the skills takes place via teaching but also through professional placements and research.

Having completed a demanding period of study, which takes from 3 to 8 years, students from these programs find themselves open to a wide range of professional perspectives, ranging across fields such as teaching, research, sports training/coaching, the sports health sector, and the sports leisure sector.



OUR PARTNERS

Circle U. is an alliance of nine partner universities (The universities of Oslo, Paris, Aarhus, Pisa, Vienna, Humboldt in Berlin, Belgrade, King's College London and Université catholique de Louvain). Their shared mission is to create an interdisciplinary, research intensive, university, called Circle U.
